THANKS TO OUR OCTOBER SPEAKER Axel Cahiz from Amazonia Orchids

Axel spoke to us in October about his specialty, Cattleya hybrids and Cattleya species plus other genera. He gave us some great tips on caring for our orchids, but his best tip was, if something works for you keep doing it! He began his talk by saying that at Amazonia, they repot their cats every 3 years. However, you should not repot a cat is when it is in sheath or in bloom.





Axel insists that our tools must be kept sterile, a rule that all good growers live by. He prefers a propane torch to sterilize, but agrees that using Clorox or TSP is adequate. When a cat needs it's roots cut way back he suggests using a very small bit of sphagnum moss on the cut end before planting. Clay pots are best for cats because they breath well, but plastic ones can be used if they have good holes for drainage. Axel likes to fill the pot about halfway with Styrofoam peanuts. His favorite medium for cats is Sterilite. He likes it's irregular shape and price. When repotting, he makes a small hill on one side of the pot with Sterilite and uses a rhizome clip to secure the plant in the pot. He also slides a plastic soda

straw over the clip to prevent damage to the plant from chemicals as the clip rusts. After potting, he adds about 1/2 tsp. of Dynamite fertilizer to the plant.

Axel also reinforces the rule of putting the name and date of repotting on the newly potted plant and keeping a record in a notebook. He likes tied on labels best and records on the label with a #2 pencil. He reminded us that a plant cannot be shown in an AOS competition without a valid name. Axel fertilizes two times a week at his nursery and suggests at least once a week for the home grower, using a 20-20-20 fertilizer such as Peter's. He says that it's important to water and fertilize on a consistent basis. Orchids do not like change. He also suggests carefully using Superthrive once a month with your regular fertilizer... (no more than 2 drops in a gal of water). He also uses a fungicide such as Physan, Captan or Copper Sulfate once a month. Note that copper sulfate will kill bromeliads. With all the rain we have had, you need to watch for rot. When the bulb of a cat turns black, it is a sign of excessive water and disease. Move that plant away from all others and cut off everything bad. Make a paste of your fungicide and put on the cut edge and hope for the best.

Scale looks like white powder on the bulb. Wash off and then use an insecticide like Orthene or Malathion, Permatrol or just plain isopropyl alcohol once a month.
