


NOVEMBER SPEAKER

October Program Presented by Mac Rivenbark

Mac Rivenbark from Mac's Orchids was our speaker for October. Mac and his lovely wife Helen brought a great selection of plants for our raffle table. His presentation on Phalaenopsis centered on the newest hybrids from Taiwan. Mac said that Taisuco, also known as Taiwan Sugar Corporation, is one of the largest and most distinguished orchid suppliers in the world. Taisuco America is doing business as McLellan Botanicals. At times you may find Taisuco orchids in Home Depot. Phals require light at about 1200 ft. candles for at least 8 hours a day. If your phals have hanging limp leaves it means that they don't have enough light. He men-

tioned that phals grow naturally on trees so it is better to grow them sideways if you can. But it should be mentioned that downward hanging leaves need more light due to the angle of the light. A healthy phal will have thick hard leaves. The best way to determine light is to hold your hand 12" above the ground. If the shadow from your hand is fuzzy and muddled, then you have 1200 ft candles of light. A good fungicide for phalaenopsis is copper. But be warned that copper will kill dendrobiums. Never use on that species. Don't put a phal above another phal or you will end up with rot. Fertilize your orchid consistently so the plants can get used to the fertilizer. Feed with micronutrients for balance. Start with small amounts of fertilizer and gradually increase to 1/2 tsp per gal. Vanda orchids are heavy feeders and need more fertilizer than other types. With vandas, start with 1/2 tsp and after a year increase to 1 tsp per gal. Dynomite is a good slow release fertilizer. Florida is too hot for the brand Osmocote. To help initiate flower spikes on Phals, feed with 1 Tbs of Epsom salts every week for 4 weeks in Sept. Phals like to be evenly moist never soppy. Fir bark is a good medium. Repot phals yearly to avoid rot. Phals can be repotted even when they are in flower, but don't remove all the roots. Pull dead roots off phals...don't cut. Phals photosynthesize through their leaves so planting is best in clear plastic pots. It is normal for phals to have roots outside the pot. Baskets also make good vessels for phals to grow in. To plant a Phal in a basket use a little sphagnum moss and remove the moss when the pant is established. 5 star sphagnum will last 18 months and 12 star sphagnum will last 12 months. Slow changes are best for all orchids. A phalaenopsis growing on a tree will have roots 20 to 30 inches long when established. Cattleyas with brown tips need calcium, and a good way to give it is to make a powder from eggshells.

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
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
