May Program Presented by Craig Morell

"Old Ways to Do Modern Things and Modern Ways to Do Old Things: Merging Modern and Classic Orchid Tactics"

Craig Morell challenged all we thought we knew about growing orchids at our May meeting. Orchids are just plants! Who knew? They can't read the culture books, and have hardly evolved at all since the turn of the 19th century. Orchids aren't even aware of all the new fertilizers and potting mediums! They might even thrive on stuff people used to grow them in one hundred years ago! You can even use fertilizer from Home Depot and they won't mind!

Craig was great. He assured us that plants just want to be healthy. Most of us are so anxious for our orchids to flower that we forget that we must first make them grow well. Most orchids would much rather grow attached to tress as nature intended, but you can't drag your tree to the orchid society for judging. He brought some of his plants to show how he challenges the norm. One of his Vandas was happily growing in a pot on a mixture of fir bark and charcoal. Another Cattleya was thriving attached to a wooden basket with absolutely no growing medium.

Craig waters his Cats only once a week...I might repeat that, once a week! He emphasized that these are succulents and need a dry period. Another of his orchids, A Cattleya Skinneri was growing happily in a wire basket, again with no medium whatsoever.

He advises that if the roots of your orchids are rotting, get rid of the medium. If the plant is small enough, trim off the bad roots and just place the plant in a clay pot, (bare root) until you see healthy roots start to form.

He likes to plant in grey Staylite rock which can be bought in bulk for about 30 cents a pound. Craig prefers mediums that don't break down and mentioned that in the early 1900's the Brits planted their orchids in broken bricks. When repotting, He prefers to use two labels to identify his plants. The first he places inside the pot away from the sunlight and the second on the

outside.

When choosing fertilizer for orchids it is important to look at the numbers. Nitrogen (N)/ Phosphorus (P) / Potassium (K). Nitrogen makes plants grow taller and greener. Phosphorus helps roots to grow and aids bloom development. Potassium helps protect the plant against



diseases and aids in drought protection and cold tolerance.

A good fertilizer is Milorganite which is a slow-release formula providing nitrogen and other nutrients over an 8-10 week period for even growth. This is especially good for Spathoglottis or ground orchids. He encourages the use of an old favorite, bone meal, which is a good source of calcium He also likes Dynamite (in the red container) which can be put in the planting hole for the roots to

grab on to. It can also be put on top of the medium to trickle in.

He cautioned against using Osmocote which could burn the plant.

Another cheap old standby since the days of the Egyptians for fungus mildew and some insects is Flowtox garden sulfur. Use at 1 to 3 Tablespoons per gal. (Smells like fireworks). It's also great on mangos, avocados and lichees for about 20 cents per pound at an agricultural supply store.

Plain old rubbing alcohol will kill white fly and mealy bugs along with thrips. It can be sprayed on plants, flowers and buds, but would need to be applied every 5-6 days and can also be applied to herbs and vegetables.

One of Craig's favorite spreader stickers is Publix's White dish washing soap. 1 Tablespoon per Gal. added to fertilizer will not only help get the fertilizer to the roots better, but it inhibits insects, flushes ants out of pots and smells really nice. Just don't forget to add the soap last, or you'll just have bubbles.

He cautioned us to be careful at orchid shows with the foreign vendors. Their plants are beautiful, but are raised in a controlled environment and may not be able to be acclimated to our climate and growing conditions.

Craig also advised that plant people love to help other plant people, so if you are new or need advice please just ask someone!
