## OUR MARCH SPEAKER Bill Peters of Whimsy Orchids "Hands on Demo"

Bill Peters has been commercially involved in the orchid growing business for 44 years. After earning a degree in horticulture at the University of Florida he worked as grower for Jones and Scully in Miami, and later as manager of Carter and Homes in South Carolina. Returning to Jones and Scully in the 80's, he was orchid manger until Hurricane Andrew. In 1994, he started

Whimsy Orchids in the Redland farming region near Homestead, specializing in collector Cattleyas. He was an organizer of the Redland Professional Orchid Growers and is instrumental in putting on the Redland Orchid Festival.

# February Program "Miltonias Some Like It Hot!" Was Presented by Brian Monk of Blu Llama Orchids

Our speaker in February was Brian Monk of Blu Llama Orchids In Ft. Lauderdale. He spoke to us about Miltonias. Found in South America,

Brazil, Panama, Columbia and Ecuador, Miltonias will grow in the heat, but they do like a heat differential. The cooler temperature in the evening and warm during the day makes for better flower pigment. These plants are easy to grow, and will produce large plants with huge numbers of flowers in only a few seasons. They are the definition of a beginner plant – one which is forgiving of most mistakes and extremes, and bounces back easily from all but the very worst transgressions. However, Miltonias do have a certain set of conditions under which they perform optimally, and if they were said to be picky, it would be these things which they prefer:

Watering habits depends on the pot and medium

They like a morning shower. Miltonias prefer to be watered early in the day.

They don't like wet feet. Miltonias prefer to be dry by nightfall.

They are sunbathers. Miltonias prefer light in the Cattleya to Vanda range.

These things are also important:

They can be rambling space-hogs. Miltonias have long intermodal distances and they grow FAST. Well-grown plants will double the number of new leads every year.

Yellow leaves are not a sign of an unhealthy plant. However, they are the sign of a Magnesium insufficiency. High light levels destroy chlorophyll, and plants need Magnesium to make more. Brian also applies Epsom salt at a rate of 1 tsp per gallon two times annually, in January and June to improve color and to help protect plants against cold. He uses Calcium to prevent leaf tip burn. Spots on leaves can be controlled by applying a fungicide approx. 3 times a year. Accordion leaves can be prevented by regular watering and care. Once this happens to the leaves it cannot be rectified.

Given these ideas, he generally like to grow Miltonias in one of three ways:

When potted, Brian uses shallow clay pots like azalea pots, and even then only use about half the depth of the pot. Miltonia roots are fine and short, and don't require a deep substrate. Fine roots need to be secure because breakage of new roots sets the plant back. Planting this way also gives more room for the plant to grow into, and I will often times use a 10 inch pot to give the plants another 1-2 growing seasons undisturbed. He uses a media of at least half inorganic/half organic; specifically he uses LECA and New Zealand bark. He uses a "medium" grade. Brian grows Brazilian Miltonias best in tree fern baskets. He finds that they do not break down quickly and therefore repotting is reduced to 2-3 yrs. He mounts his Miltonias exclusively on tree fern slabs or poles. He prefer slabs, and after he secures the plant he simply lays the slab flat. Tree fern is wonderful stuff, it wets easily and drains well, and Miltonias seem to like it above all other substrates.
