Our November Program "How to Grow Phalaenopsis" Was Presented by Jose Exposito of Soroa Orchids

We were fortunate to have Jose Exposito from Soroa Orchids speak to us about orchid culture. If you have not had a chance to visit in nursery in Homestead, you owe yourself a visit. The grounds are just beautiful and the staff is very friendly and helpful.

Jose pointed out that many of us are trying to grow well orchids that naturally come from very different regions of the world and we are attempting to do this

in one area under the same culture. Naturally, some plants will do well and others will die. The problem is that we need to adapt our culture to the needs of plants that come from the various regions (or, do as I do and grow plants that will do well in your particular environment!)

The biggest problem growing orchids is overwatering. The mortality rate increases in the summertime during our rainy season. Jose states that there are two types of waterers: the grower that religiously waters once per week and the forgetful waterer. I don't know about you but I have so many mounted orchids that I water almost daily so I have to be mindful about what medium I use for the plants in pots and baskets so that they aren't overwatered. The important thing is to water very well when you do water. Water until the roots change color. Many of us do not spray the roots long enough for the plants to absorb adequate water.

Listen to your plants! Most of the orchids that we grow are epiphytic and grow up high (air movement!). Learn to listen to your plants the same way that you listen to your pets. Plants have a language, learn it. Jose advises us to learn about how our orchids grow in their natural environment. This is what we should attempt to mimic. Mounting is great for epiphytic orchids. Mounted plants also do very well during our rainy season. I know that I have never had a problem with rot on any of my mounted plants.

I know that I have had a problem growing Phalaenopsis outdoors because it's impossible to keep water out of the crown when they are grown outdoors in pots or baskets. Jose advises that Phals should be mounted on plaques and grown sideways so that water can drain away from the crown – just as they grow on trees in nature.

Jose recommends not watering before fertilizing. The velamen has a limited ability to absorb water so if you water first, the plant often is unable to absorb anything additional and the fertilizer is wasted. Watering also further dilutes whatever fertilizer you are applying.

Time release fertilizer 14-4-14 in small bags are beneficial as the plant will receive nutrients each time we water. I buy large quantities of polyester organza bags on Ebay. They will last several seasons outdoors although I replace them each year. Empty tea bags are also available but I have found that they disintegrate within a few months.

Plant Health

Jose gave us the following tips to maintain a clean growing area and healthy plants:

- To help control pests in your growing area it is important to keep the area very clean. Dispose of dead leaves and flowers.
- It is important to have good air circulation.
- Neosporin is beneficial for controlling bacteria. (I'm going to try this next time I have to make a cut!)
- Cooking oil at the rate of 1T per gallon of water with 1T of baking soda is a natural defense against scale (remember to only apply any type of oil in the evening, not in the heat of the day)
- Hydrogen peroxide and cinnamon should be kept on hand.
- Any product that is labelled for use on roses is generally safe for orchids.
- The best time to spray any chemicals is at dusk. Many chemicals are petroleum-based so there is a chance of burning the plants if they are sprayed early in the day because the weather heats up so quickly here.
- The best time to water is in the morning so that the plants will be dry by nightfall.

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
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
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
